For Your Information...

Researchers at the University of Chicago, have proven for the first time that fish oil can slow the formation of aterial deposits, which are the primary cause of heart attacks and strokes.

The scientists fed a diet high in fish oil to 16 Rheses monkeys, who developed far fewer arterial deposits (plaque) that 8 monkeys fed a diet high in coconut oil, a saturated fat known to contribute to the development of arteriosclerosis.

According to an article in Prevention (April '87), the plaque that did develop in the fish-oil-fed monkeys was found to be less likely to cause medical complications and contained fewer inflammatory cells. Levels of LDL cholesterol--considered a risk factor for heart disease-- were also lower with the fish-oil diet.

Ther studies have found that fish oil can lower blood cholesterol and inhibit blood clotting. This study marks the first time that researchers actually measured the effects of fish oil on the arterial wall, according to Robert Wissler, M.D., Ph.D., professor of pathology at the University of Chicago.

"It comes down to economics," said Pace. "Property owners figure they can save money by paying someone minimum wage to watch a property." Apartment dwellers rarely take these watchmen seriously. A few even become targets of kids in the area, someone to fool. "You also have to figure with a guy getting minimum wage he won't have a high stake in the job".

Canyon Security depends on a professional presence, and a group of eager employees. "It does your heart good to watch the dogs getting ready for work," Flynn continued. "Watching them bouncing around really gets you pumped up to work. On the job we don't ususally get any arguments and people find it's harder to sneak around a dog."

"Our service is a bit more expensive than other systems, said Pace." But there are ways of getting around it." Several neighboring apartment complexes have chipped in to split Canyon's fee, extending the coverage area. "We prefer working that way, Flynn continued, "It's boring work sitting at one complex. It's a longshot that something will happen on a given night. If we keep moving around, the bad guys think we're everywhere. They figure they can't win, then they get out of the area." Canyon Crest has worked its way out of a few jobs with this method.

As the questions of protection increase Pace figures the demand for both the security services, and obedience training will grow. "People should take the time to know their dogs, be aware of their potential. There's no excuse for negligence", he concluded.
